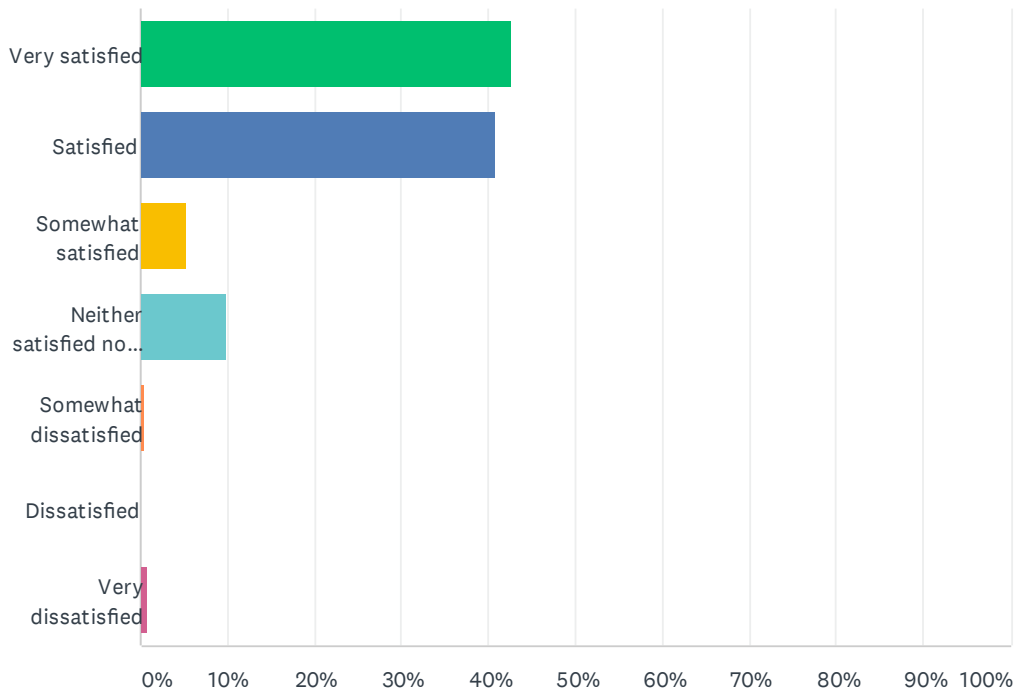


# Q1 Overall, how satisfied have you been, generally speaking, with the CBLCA and the activities it has run over the last several years?

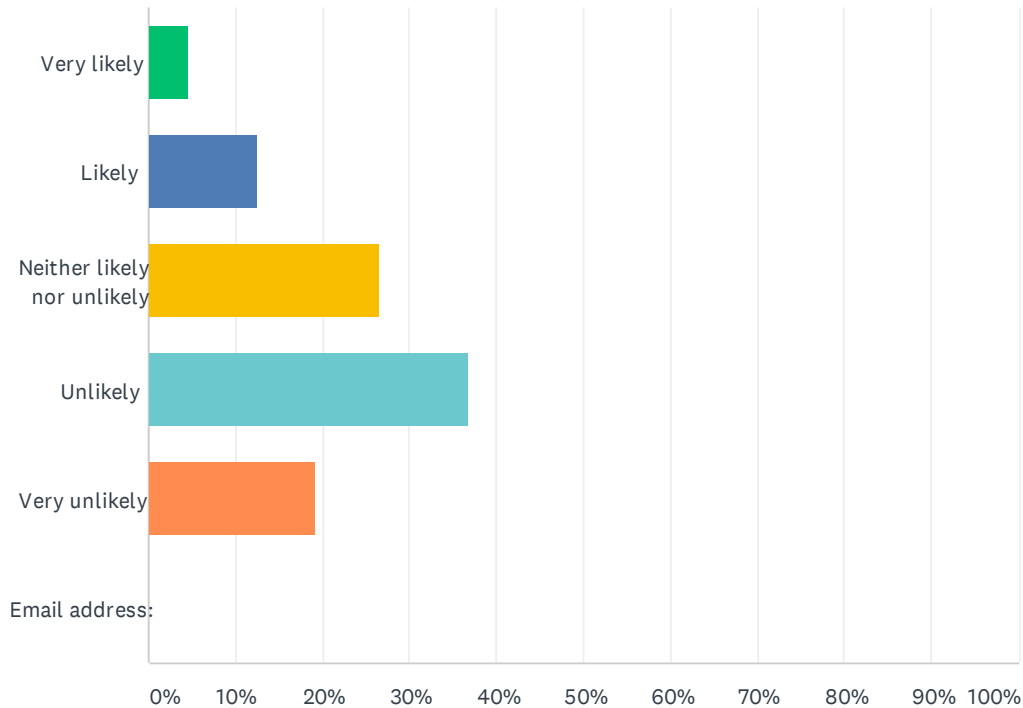

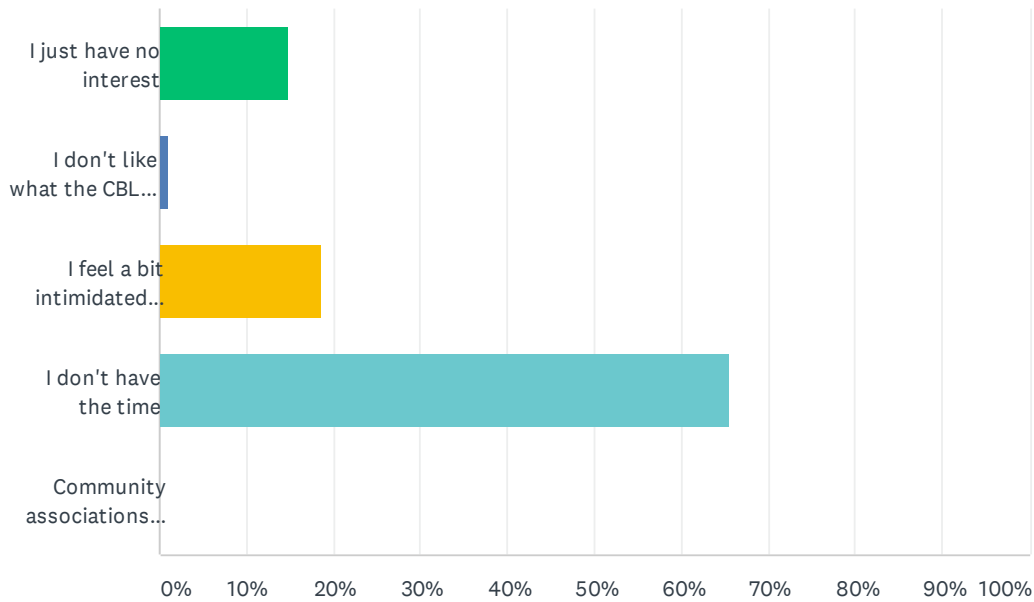

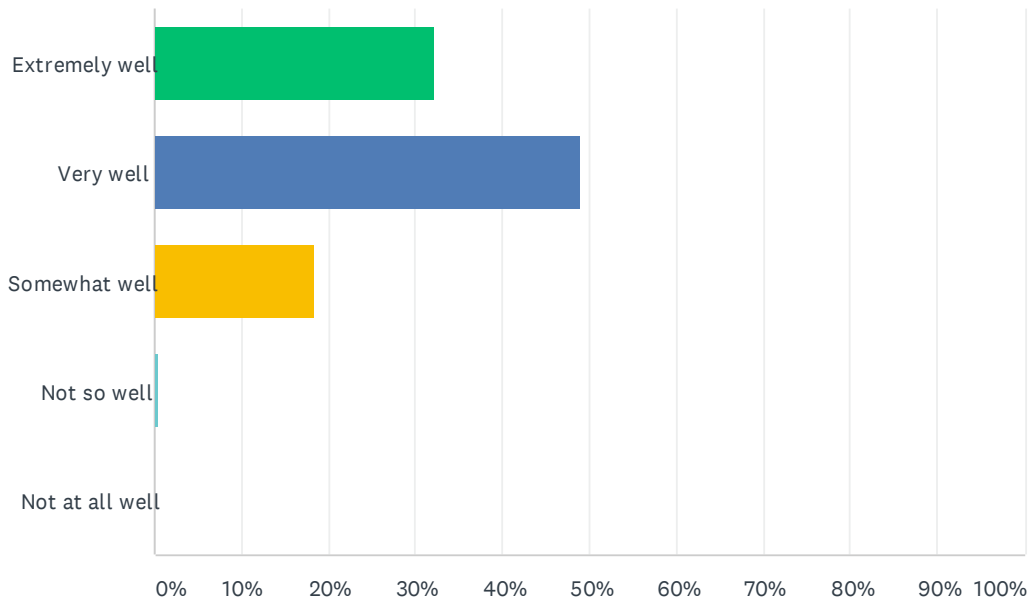

## Q8 How well does the CBLCA e-newsletter offer relevant information and meet your needs?

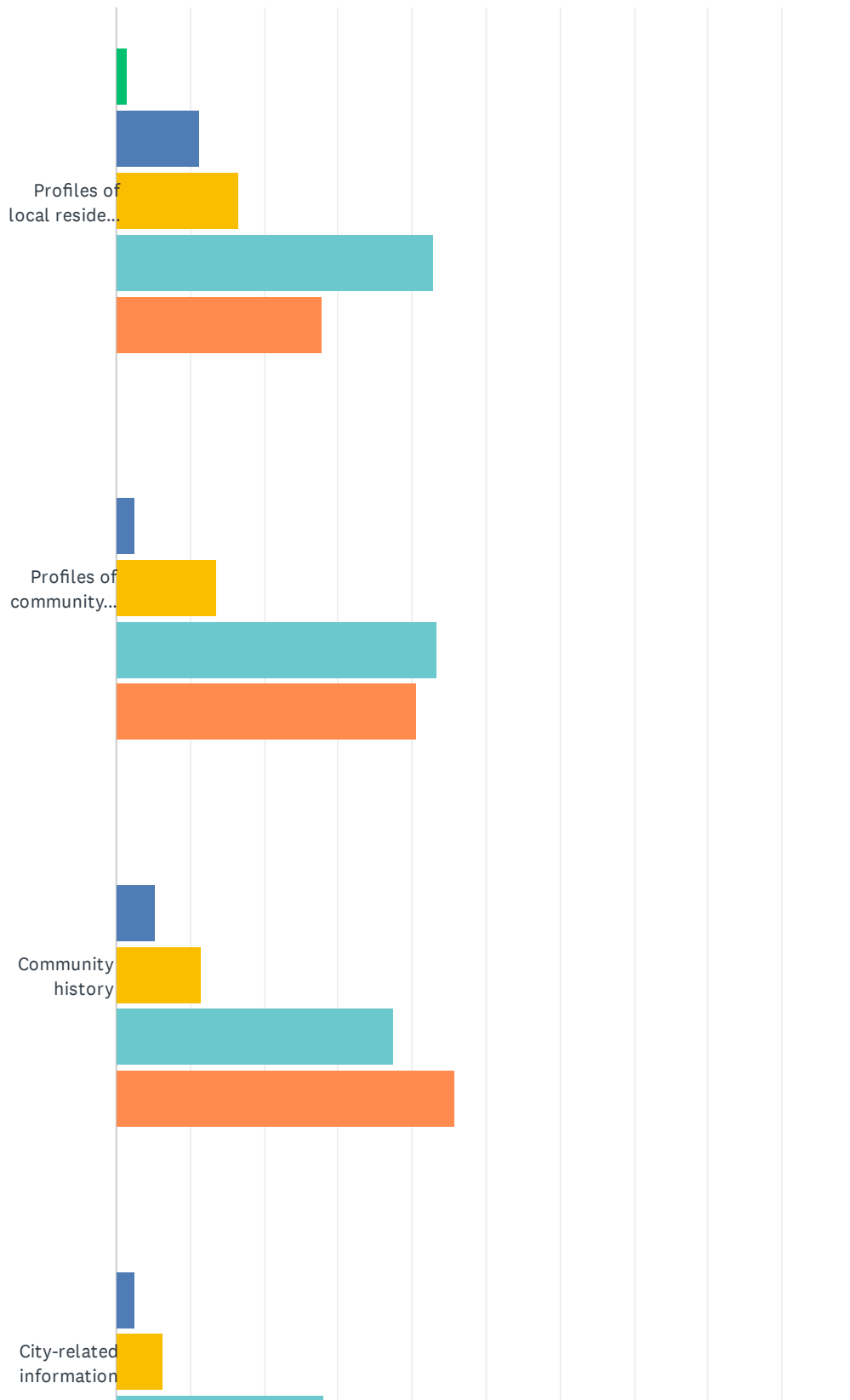

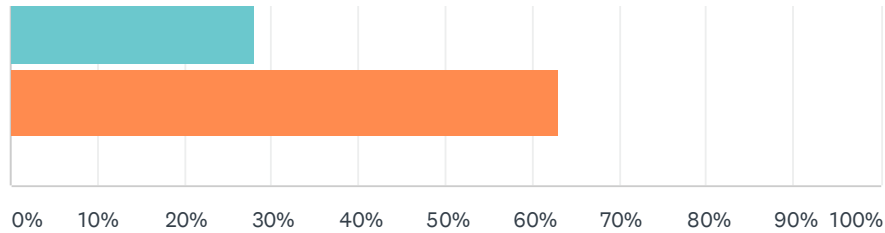

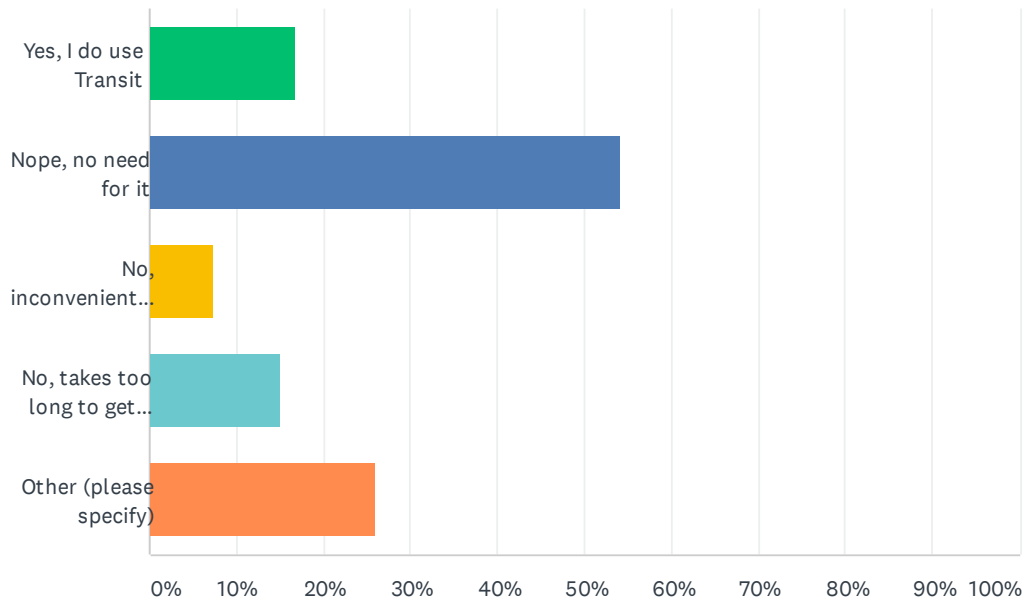

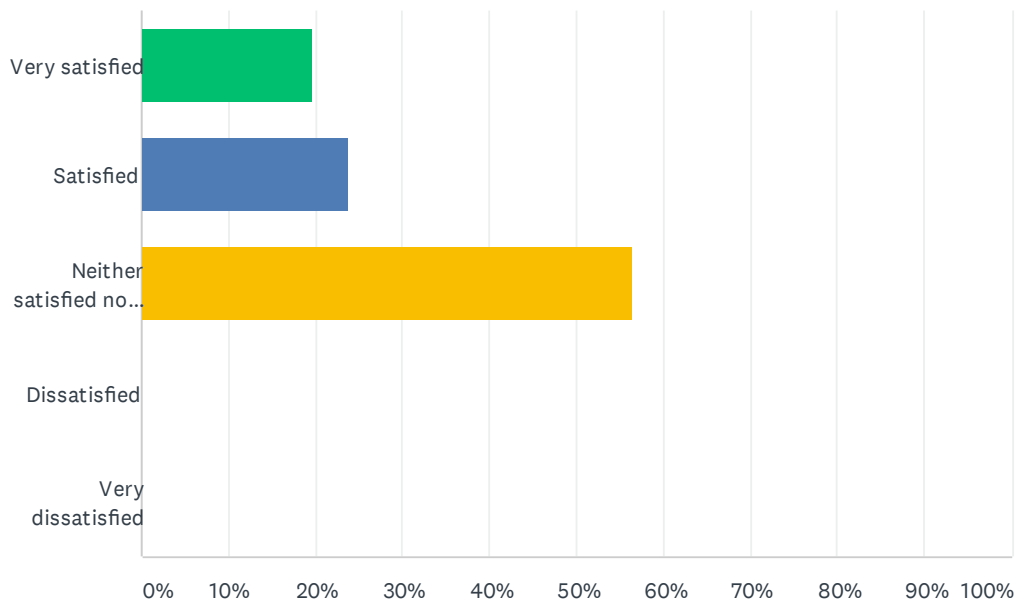

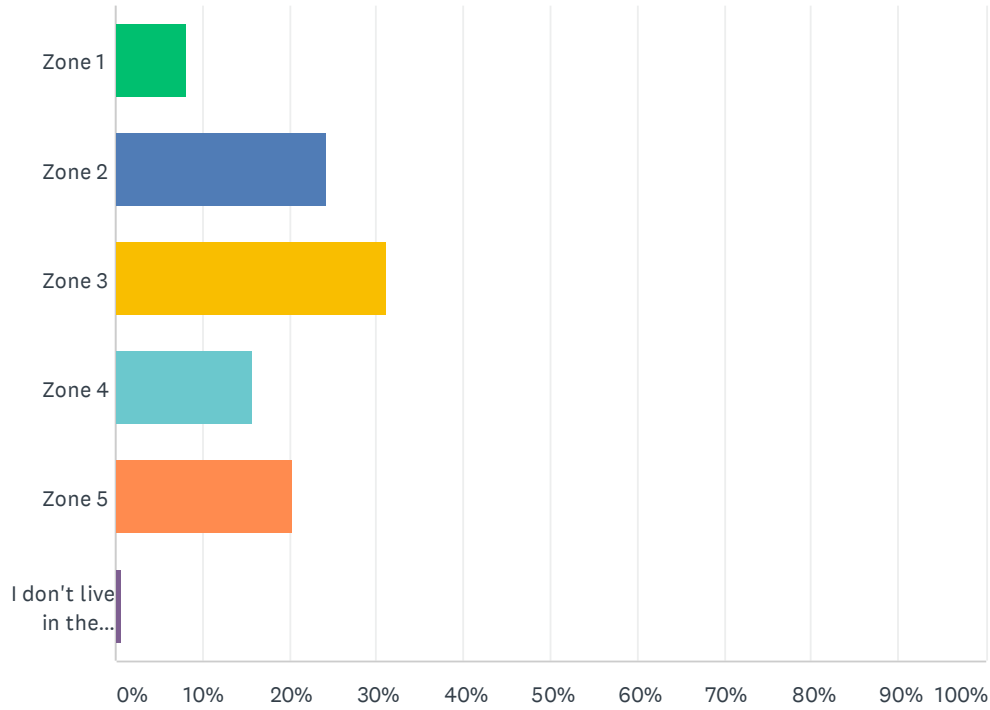

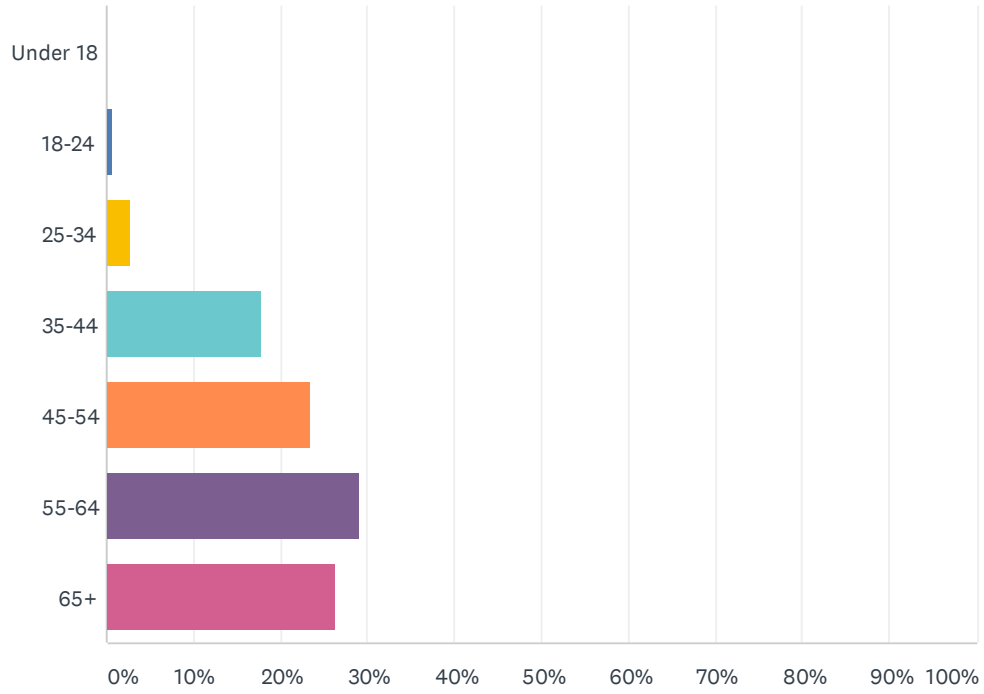
